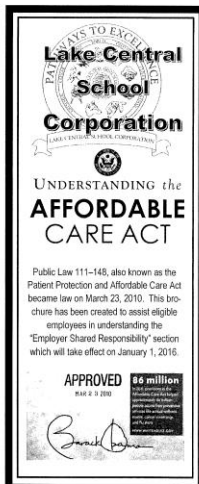

Q. Which employees previously not eligible for health care through Lake Central School Corporation will now be eligible?

A. The law states that every employee that works an average of 30 hours per week shall be offered an insurance plan.

Q. Since many Lake Central employees do not work year round, how will it be determined if an employee averages 30 hours per week?

A. The law states that any break in service longer than 4 weeks cannot be included in the calculation. For this reason, Lake Central will calculate an average based on 41 weeks. The threshold for qualifying for the new plan will be 6.75 hours per day.

What are the costs and benefits of the new plan?

- The cost to eligible employees has been set at \$1,125 for 2016 (per law the cost may not exceed 9.56% of the federal poverty level)
- Lake Central School Corporation will pay the remaining \$5,559 for 2016 toward the cost of a single plan
- Wellness activities such as mammograms, prenatal care, immunizations, etc. are provided at no cost to participants
- Dental and Vision are not included in this plan
- Deductible for a single plan is \$6,000 and \$12,000 for a family plan

Who made the rules for what the plan must provide to employees?

- The plan is required to meet minimum value standards set forth by the Department of Health and Human Services.
- All rules related to who is offered coverage, what the coverage consists of and the cost were determined by the federal government.



What if I qualify but already have coverage through the federal marketplace or my spouse's plan?

- Employees offered coverage through their employer are no longer eligible for subsidies through the federal marketplace.
- Some employers do not provide health care coverage for spouses. If the spouse's employer offers coverage, if you are currently on your spouse's plan, please check the rules of their plan to see if you are still eligible.
