

KINDERGARTEN IN LAKE CENTRAL

- Half-day program
 - AM session (8:10 - 10:40)
 - Limited number of sites
 - District will transport to school only
- Full-day program
 - 8:10 – 2:40

Full-Day vs. Half-Day Kindergarten

- Both programs teach the Indiana Academic Standards
- HDK students attend computers and library each week
- FDK students attend art, music, PE, computers and library each week
- FDK students have additional time for enrichment and/or interventions

Kindergarten Costs

- 2018/2019 textbook rental and fees will be set later this spring.
- Currently they are:
 - \$140.69 FDK
 - \$129.14 HDK

How to prepare your child for Kindergarten

- Buy their supplies for school and home (maybe a few extra)
- Make sure they are kid friendly supplies & coats
- Make sure all supplies are labeled
- Have a trial run lunch with your child
- Good bedtime routines-early bedtime
- Practice good eye contact with your child
- Practice giving your child a 2 step direction
- Practice cutting
- Practice waiting
- Watch how your child holds their pencil and writes
- Play a game and make your child lose
- Have your child clean up their messes



Separation Anxiety




- Picture of Family in Folder
- Read a book about starting Kindergarten
- Put your child in a summer library program, sport or town program so they can interact with other kids as well as separate from you
- Develop a goodbye ritual (Kiss or special wave)
- Don't give in
- Keep calm during separation

ORIENTATION MEETING

- Held on first day for some of the schools
 - Parent and child attend
 - Approximately one hour in length
- Chance to meet the teacher

Some of the schools will have a meet the teacher night for parents only.

- Receive information regarding classroom procedures and expectations
- PTO Packets are handed out
- Your home school will send out information about all these important dates that will take place at your school
- No Crying!




First Day of School

First Week of School & Tips

- Have your child ride the bus the first week
- Have your child order a school lunch the first week
- Do not walk your child down after the first day
 - Label everything-child's name, teacher's name, lunch money
- Have your child at school on time
- Keep all Emergency information updated
- Check your child's folder nightly
- Communicate with your child's teacher-you are their 1st teacher-positives and negatives-change in routines

- good attendance
- Vacations
- Illness Policy
- Sneezing & Blowing noses

- We will TRC each child 3 times a year (Text Reading and Comprehension) your child to find out their reading levels.

- Be able to write Narrative and How to books








WHAT DO I BRING?

- **Proof of Residency**
- **Driver License**

Sign-in table

- Boundary check
- Age check
- Information Packet



Sign-in Table, continued

- Information packet given
 - Items to take home
 - information sheets
 - physical form
 - immunization information
- Items to complete
 - enrollment form
 - residency form
 - nurse information
 - session preference (Half or Full-day)
 - Home Language Survey

Sign-in Table, continued

- Information to bring with you
 - original birth certificate
 - the official registration with the county
 - proof of residency
 - current utility bill with name and address
 - home agreement or a contract to purchase
 - rental agreement or lease
 - emergency phone numbers
 - doctor and dentist name and phone

The Child's Role



Station to Station

- **Waiting Area**
- **Hands-on Activity**
- **Kindergarten Screening**



You are finished when...

- **Child has completed all stations**
 - usually has dots on name tag for each station
- **Parents have completed all paperwork and checked out with school secretary**

Who needs to register?

- All children who have reached the age of 5 on or before August 1
- Children enrolled in West Lake preschool who meet age requirements
