2. Special Education Accountability Data

Results-Driven Accountability Data Retreat

- Private school data was excluded from the analysis; however, charter schools were not. The comparison with charter schools is problematic because they do not serve the variety of students that we do, particularly those with more significant disabilities.
- The current process of sorting schools into quintiles based on performance will remain an issue if the schools being compared are not similar.
- Current system means that schools who show improvements may not see an improvement in overall ratings if schools across the state are also improving.
- Schools were forced into quintiles even with the overall data distribution was small.
- Lake Central received a 1 for our ISTAR-KR data which showed 73% of our students showing growth before exiting. Schools earning a 3 showed 75% of students with growth and those earning a 5 showed approximately 85% of students with growth.
- Students who were dismissed from services were not counted in our ISTAR-KR data. This is problematic because these are likely our students with the most growth. We will now complete the ISTAR before they are dismissed and now include the eligibility area they had prior to dismissal.
- Schools that met or exceeded the goal for the percentage of students served in inclusive LRE categories still received low "points" in the current quintile system.
- Staff from the DOE expressed that the goal of the system is not punitive, but is designed to encourage schools to focus on their data. Directors expressed concern that providing a "rating" will always results in a judgement of the services we are providing. Staff from DOE acknowledged that there are issues in the current system, but was unsure of how it may be changes in the future.

Bibich Elementary recently raised \$1,999.11 as part of the Kids Heart Challenge. The school would like to donate the \$1,999.11 raised to the American Heart Association. The Homan Student Council hosted a Valentine’s raffle and would like to donate the \$500 raised to Treasured Friends Animal Rescue. The Lake Central High School Theatre Troup performed an Improv Night, which collected \$346.
