#### Summaries:

One: In order to provide the students with a more realistic and hands-on experience, I am asking that a class set of Arduino boards be purchased that will be used in all computer Science I students following Indiana University's Computer Science curriculum.

Two: I am looking to encourage individualized reading through implementation of "First Chapter Friday" in my 4th grade classroom.

Three: The goal of Cooperative Learning Literature Circles is for all students in a second grade classroom to be exposed to and read the I CAN READ book series at differentiated reading levels. Also to grow as Literature Circles group members working together to discuss books in depth with each other while using reading strategies to grow as a stronger reader.

Four: Grant funds will be used for purchasing sequels and additional books in the series for those novels we read in class as part of the curriculum, including *Drums*, *Girls*, and *Dangerous Pie*, *Out of My Mind*,

Gregor the Overlander, and The Giver to promote an excitement of reading in students and increase student engagement both in and out of the classroom.

Five: Words have a dramatic impact on what we know, how we interact with people and the decisions we ultimately make. Words can influence us, inspire us or just as easily bring us to tears. I want to be a facilitator of that power in a positive, productive way for my students with the use of a six-word "memoir".

Six: Through years of experimentation, design, growth, and teamwork, Science Olympiad has become one of the most innovative ways to develop young leaders, like Middle Schoolers, that may have the chance to change our world all from their experiences they received here, at Clark Middle School, during Science Olympiad as early as 5th graders looking in, all the way up to the top, as 8th graders.

Seven: Math stations with math games, manipulatives, and activities support learners interest and promote the development of more complex math skills and social interaction.

Eight: Students will read biography books at their reading level and complete a research report (in Google Slides) based on their person of interest to present to their peers.

Nine: The International Games and Activity Unit will enhance elementary physical education through connecting language arts, history, geography and math to the physical skills and strategy of sports form around the world.

Ten: Project LIT is a dynamic club of like-minded 7th and 8th grade reader leaders who wish to have fun reading, talking about and promoting books to students at Clark Middle School.

A: This Seed Grant will help purchase supplies for emergency preparedness buckets for all the Lake Central School Corporation schools, staff and students, to be used in the event of a lockdown drill or another crisis.

#### Legislative Update 4.4.22

HEA 1073 Limit to elearning Days

HEA 1073 Provides that a public school may conduct not more than three virtual student instructional days that do not meet the established requirements. Provides that a public school that does not comply with these provisions may not count a student instructional day toward the 180-day student instructional day requirement. Allows the department to waive these requirements (IDOE will explain the waiver process in a webinar on April 22, indications are that synchronous, (live instruction), will be a requirement.

II. HEA 1468 Student ID Grades 6-12 must include emergency information

IDOE recommends National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, National Human Trafficking Hotline, Teen Dating Violence, and National Sexual Assault Hotline be added to each student's identification card for easy reference.

III. SB 331 Clarity to 45% rule regarding tuition support to teachers.

This legislation cleared up the problem with only the LEA in special education cooperatives being allowed to count their teacher expenditures. School districts may include the money they send to a cooperative or career center as part of this calculation.

A follow up piece of legislation is expected in the next session to change the formula in order to include all fringe benefits. This is prudent as public school employees receive significant compensation in the form of health insurance and pension contributions. Creating a seamless way to code fringe benefit expenditures so they are tied to specific employees is being developed by the State Board of Accounts. Many districts opt to offer better health care in lieu of higher salary and this needs to be taken into account.



#### Resolution Authorizing Appointment of Appraisers (Action Required)

In order to finance the upcoming Bibich Elementary School project, the school district will sell a portion of the Bibich property to the Lake Central Multi District School Building Corporation, whom the school district will then enter into a lease agreement for the length of the bonds. Before the sale can take place and a new lease entered into, three appraisals are required of the property. This resolution approves the process for the appointment of appraisers for the sale process.

# Professional Leave Requests (Action Required)

I am requesting professional leave for myself and three of our Extra-Curricular Bookkeepers, Meryl Larson, Karen Sulek, and Nicole Matchain to attend the IASBO ECA Seminar in Indianapolis on April 14<sup>th</sup>. This is an annual seminar put on by IASBO that all of our other ECA Bookkeepers in the district have attended during their career.

The Administration recommends approving the professional leave requests as indicated above.

#### <u>Donations (Action Required)</u> Received

Bibich Elementary School received a donation of \$25.25 from Coca Cola.

The Lake Central High School Athletic Department received an anonymous donation of \$100 during the recent basketball sectionals. The Athletic Department also received a \$2,000 anonymous donation to go toward the Girls Golf team.

Kahler Middle School received a donation of \$450 from Texas Roadhouse. The proceeds will be used toward the purchase of football helmets for their team.

#### Given

Lake Central High School recently held a St Baldrick's event to raise money for Childhood Cancer. A total of \$18,526.41 was raised by the students and staff. The funds did not run through an LCHS club or the school. Payments were made directly to the St Baldrick's Foundation.

Homan Elementary raised \$2,949.04 for the American Heart Association (AHA) through the Kids Heart Challenge. Except for \$100, all of the money was directly donated electronically to the AHA. Homan is requesting to donate the \$100 collected through the school to the AHA.

Bibich Elementary also held a fundraiser for the American Heart Association (AHA) and raised \$525. \$250 of that amount was paid directly to the AHA; the school would like to donate the \$275 collected locally to the AHA.

Prior to Spring Break, Homan Elementary School celebrated Inclusion Matters. The school raised \$318.26 and would like to donate the collections to Hannah's Hope. Hannah's Hope is a NW Indiana non-profit which provides developmental equipment to kids with special needs and connects families by making life and communities more accessible. We have been fortunate enough to have several Homan students benefit from this amazing organization.

The Administration recommends approving the donations as indicated above.

#### 2022 Tax Rates

Now that the 2022 tax rates have been set by the Department of Local Government Finance, I will be giving the school board an update on our Lake Central School Corporation rate, as well as the overall tax rates for the communities we serve.

#### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPOINTMENT OF APPRAISER

Whereas the Board of School Trustees (the "Board") of the Lake Central School Corporation (the "School Corporation") has made a preliminarily determination to enter into a lease or an amendment to lease for the proposed capital improvements at facilities throughout the School Corporation, including but not limited to, the renovation, improvement and expansion of Bibich Elementary School, and the acquisition of equipment and technology for use throughout the School Corporation (collectively, the "Projects"), capitalized interest, and the necessary and incidental costs of issuance; and

WHEREAS, the Lake Central Multi-District School Building Corporation (the "Building Corporation"), was organized pursuant to the provisions of the Indiana Nonprofit Corporation Act of 1991 for the purpose of constructing and leasing school facilities to the School Corporation as authorized by the Indiana Code 20-47-3 and -4; and

WHEREAS, the Building Corporation must acquire certain real estate from the School Corporation in connection with the Projects and will then lease the same to the School Corporation;


