Weather Cancellation Criteria and Process

- I. Timing of Decision
 - a. Most Parents Prefer a Decision ASAP (the night before)
 - b. With snow, generally want to see the conditions (AM call)
 - c. With snow, goal is to decide by 5:15 am
 - d. Consensus of Weather Forecasts
 - i. 1.12.24 Rain Window varied until morning
 - ii. In the morning, both commutes looked hazardous
- II. Wind chill (National Weather Service Chart)
 - a. For over 20 years, standard has been -20 real feel
 - b. When the temperature falls below zero, any wind pushes temperature near -20
 - c. Forecasts better predict wind speed than snowfall amounts
 - d. Two hour delay does not yield much increase in temperature
- III. Snow Day Data
 - a. Forecasts (multiple sites)
 - b. Road conditions – inspection by staff, consult with PD
 - c. Local police and street departments (after heavy snowfall)
 - d. Sidewalks
- IV. When weather arrives during the day, why no early dismissal?
 - a. Early elementary students should not be dropped without supervision
 - b. LCHS will dismiss early to keep Elementary on time
- V. Who Makes the Final Call?
 - a. Superintendent
 - b. Assistant Superintendent
 - c. Transportation Director

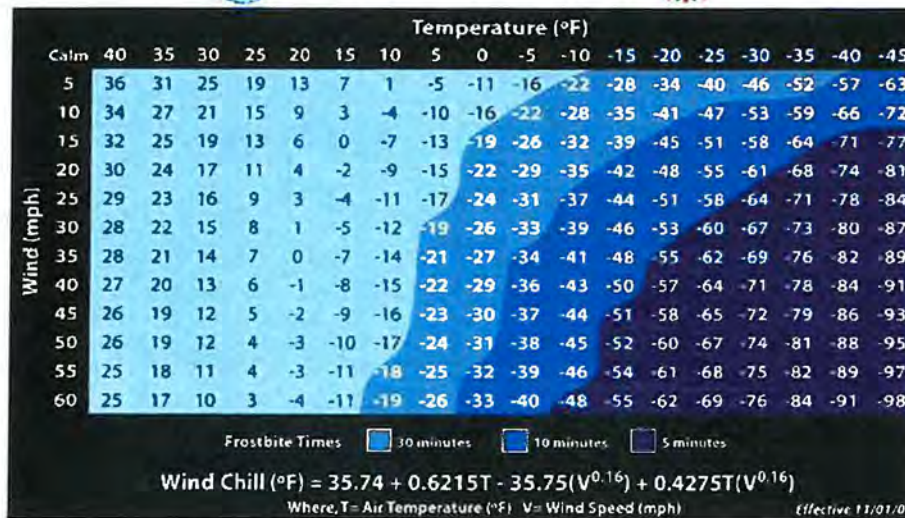

The NWS Wind Chill Temperature (WCT) index uses advances in science, technology, and computer modeling to provide an accurate, understandable, and useful formula for calculating the dangers from winter winds and freezing temperatures. The index does the following:

- Calculates wind speed at an average height of 5 feet, the typical height of an adult human face, based on readings from the national standard height of 33 feet, which is the typical height of an anemometer
- Is based on a human face model
- Incorporates heat transfer theory based on heat loss from the body to its surroundings, during cold and breezy/windy days
- Lowers the calm wind threshold to 3 mph
- Uses a consistent standard for skin tissue resistance
- Assumes no impact from the sun, i.e., clear night sky.

Wind Chill Temperature is defined only for temperatures at or below 50°F and wind speeds above 3 mph.

Legislative Update 2.5.24 (2.6.24 is halfway mark of short session)

- I. SB 1 Retention of students below standard on IREAD 3
 - a. Big question remains: how expansive will retention become?
 - b. Recently we shared with our elected officials some scenarios that show how retention based solely on a one-day test can be unfair to children
 - c. ELL students being retained after 24 months of exposure to the language is unfair
 - d. Students without a Good Cause exemption who demonstrate marked improvement from their performance in grade 2 should not be retained
 - e. Students who test for the first time in grade 3 who barely miss and are otherwise academically successful should not be retained
 - f. Deeper analysis of similar legislation in other states and the statistical correlation to poverty must be acknowledged and debated
- II. HB 1376 Limits on Referenda Voting
 - a. Fall general election referendum language is now limited to capital projects
 - b. Recently we shared with our representatives the benefits of May elections when it comes to operating referenda
 - c. We also shared some ideas regarding the required language for referenda questions and the misleading nature of the requirement
- III. HB 1073 Cameras in Special Needs Classrooms
 - a. Some legislators indicating teachers will appreciate the “protection”
 - b. Very few teachers have publicly concurred and teacher organizations have expressed opposition to classroom cameras
 - c. Increased surveillance of staff does not seem necessary but our elected officials need to hear from the very individuals who could be impacted

New Course Proposals 2024

7143 Management Fundamentals

2 semesters, 2 credits

Required Prerequisites: Principles of Business Management

Management Fundamentals describes the functions of managers, including the management of activities and personnel. Describes the judicial system and the nature and sources of law affecting business. Studies contracts, sales contracts with emphasis on Uniform Commercial Code Applications, remedies for breach of contract and tort liabilities. Examines legal aspects of property ownership, structures of business ownership, and agency relationships. **This is a CTE course, for funding and employment follow-up; the student's social security number will be needed.**

- Recommended Grade(s): 10, 11, 12
- Counts as a directed elective or elective for all diplomas

Rationale: This is a Concentrator course in the Business Administration Pathway under the Next Level Programs of Study (NLPS).

7145 Digital Marketing

DGTL MARK

2 semesters, 2 credits

Required Prerequisites: Principles of Business Management; Marketing Fundamentals

Digital Marketing provides an introduction to the world of e-commerce and digital marketing media. The course covers how to integrate digital media and e-commerce into organizational and marketing strategy. Students will explore e-commerce applications and the most popular digital marketing tactics and tools. Emphasizes familiarity with executing digital media, understanding the marketing objectives that digital media can help organizations achieve, and establishing and enhancing an organization's digital marketing presence.

- Recommended Grade(s): 10, 11, 12
- Counts as a directed elective or elective for all diplomas

Rationale: This is a Concentrator course in the Marketing and Sales Pathway under the Next Level Programs of Study (NLPS).

M25950 PRIME Math

2 semesters, 2 credits

Required Prerequisites: Algebra II, Analytical Algebra II

Fulfills a Mathematics course requirement for all diplomas

The PRIME Math course utilizes a curriculum developed by the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) that includes and reinforces the Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and Statistics skills necessary for postsecondary success. This course emphasizes understanding of math concepts rather than just memorizing procedures. PRIME math emphasizes students' reasoning and sense making about procedures (e.g. why to use a certain formula or method to solve a problem). This equips them with higher-order thinking skills in order to apply math skills, functions, and concepts in different situations. The course is intended for students who currently have achieved the minimum math requirement at the secondary level, but need additional experiences to enhance their mathematical knowledge before pursuing credit-bearing courses at a postsecondary institution.

- Recommended Grade: 12
- Counts as a directed elective or elective for all diplomas

Rationale:

PRIME is designed for students who have currently achieved the minimum math requirement for a CORE 40 diploma but may still require additional assistance as they prepare for their next steps after high school. The ideal student is a senior who has passed Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and earned between a 400 and 500 on the math portion of the SAT. To support students as they transition from high school to college, four Indiana higher education institutions - Ivy Tech Community College, Indiana State University, the University of Southern Indiana, and Purdue University West Lafayette - will place students who have completed PRIME with a B or higher directly into their quantitative reasoning course without the need for additional remediation. Purdue University will also place students directly into their college Algebra or Mathematics for Elementary teacher's course.

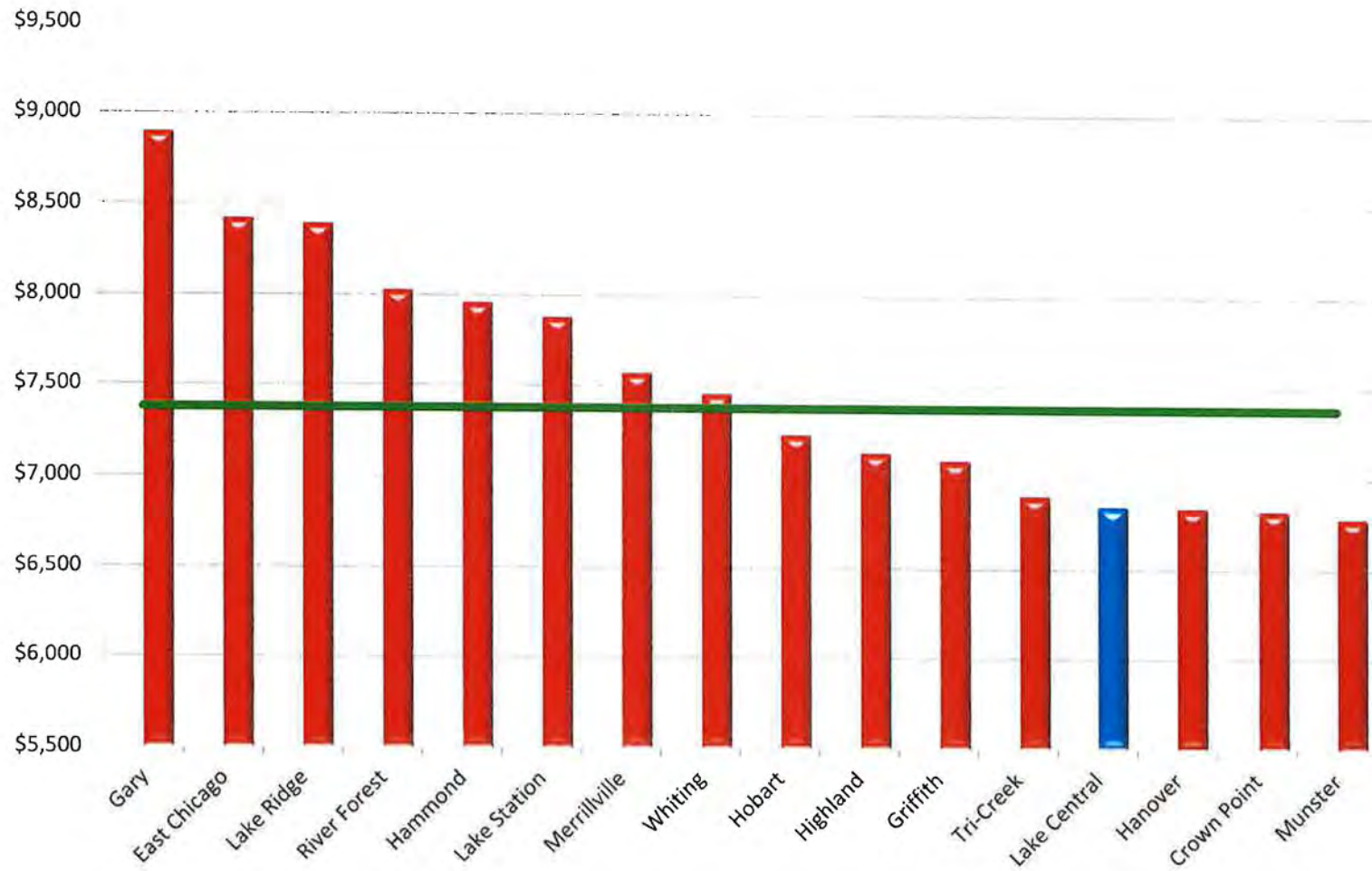
