Mr. Newcomb and his fiancée traveled all the way to Indianapolis to support and cheer on his students. That tells a lot of what kind of mentor and man he is. The athletes, if you could have seen their faces when they saw him that day at their state tournament, you would have cried. Jon Newcomb deserves this award for the shining educator that he is. I would like to nominate Becky Szczesniak from Bibich Elementary school for the 2025 Impact Award. Our family has been fortunate enough to have Becky involved in our son's educational journey since kindergarten. She exemplifies all of the qualities that are deserving of this award and so much more. In the educational world, paraprofessionals serve a very important role in each student's life. They not only serve as an educational tool for the student to stay on task and work at their pacing through the task at hand but they also serve to nurture, support and give love to the student. This is exactly what Ms. Becky does each day with all of her students that she helps. Ms. Becky was and still is a key person on our son's team at Bibich Elementary School. She supports our son's emotional well-being each day. She does so by making sure she not only greets him each day with a smile but gives him one of her special hugs. My son lights up every time he sees Ms. Becky or even talks about her at home. The days that Ms. Becky is not in the classroom, throws off my son's routine which shows the impact that her presence has. Ms. Becky and my son have formed a very special bond that started in kindergarten and has only grown since then. One of the largest roles that Ms. Becky has had in these years with my son is helping grow his confidence in both his abilities and independence in the classroom. At the start of the school year, my son did not like school and was having a tough time adjusting into 2nd grade. But with Ms. Becky's presence in the classroom, she was the joy that my son found in the reassurance of her hugs, in her encouraging words, and the support that she provided each day. As a mother, knowing that Ms. Becky is in my son's classroom providing the best support for both his education and well-being reassures my heart that my son will be successful. I highly recommend Ms. Becky as the 2025 Impact Award based on her outstanding qualities as a paraprofessional.

My daughter is a difficult child to control. However, after meeting Miss Becky, she became much calmer and started to follow the lessons. My daughter really likes Miss Becky and has a deep bond with her.

Mrs. Szczesniak is a paraprofessional in my classroom. Everyday she goes above and beyond to help her students. She thinks outside the box to find ways for her students to learn. She shows compassion and dedication to students and staff.

### **Related Service Provider - Alison Petralia - Principal - Bibich Elementary**

My son started kindergarten this year at Bibich. He was born with congenital heart disease. He had 3 open heart surgeries before the age of 2. He has been hospitalized many times due to his heart. Last year he had his first seizure. The cause of his seizures is from going into cardiac arrest after his 1st open heart surgery. He is on seizure medication but because his seizures can last so long he has emergency medication at school. I was absolutely terrified sending him to school. Mrs. Petralia has gone above and beyond for me but most importantly my son. My son suffers from anxiety and that can be a huge challenge. Mrs. Petralia is always helping the kids get out of the car in the morning when I drop him off. When my son is having a tough day she will comfort him and encourage him to class. She has attended his IEP meetings to make sure his needs are met. When he started having seizures he was in preschool at Bibich. I sent her an email about what happened. She called me immediately and set up a meeting with every teacher and aides he had at the time. My son also has a brother at Bibich which Mrs. Petralia had his teacher at the meeting too. She wanted to make sure both boys needs were met and they had the support from everyone at Bibich. My biggest concern was if my son had a seizure at school and I couldn't get there fast enough before the paramedics took him to the hospital. Mrs. Petralia said she would go with him and wouldn't leave him until I got there. That not only made my nerves calm but my son was so excited to hear that she would never leave him. My son tells me when he grows up he wants to be a principal like Mrs. Petralia. Mrs. Petralia is more than a principal. She is a loving and compassionate person. She absolutely deserves this award because she is the reason my son loves to go to school. As a mom I feel 100% safe knowing that Mrs. Petralia is looking after my son. It's absolutely terrifying sending your son to school with a medical condition but when you have Mrs. Petralia on your side it really makes it so much easier.



## Legislative Update 3.3.25

### HB 1500 TAG to TIG

- Geographic shortage of teachers
  - New teachers in high needs areas could receive a TIG over a veteran in an area that is not high need or have state assessments
  - Existing teachers in high needs areas will be tempted to hop districts
- Significant student growth as measured by I Read 3 or ILEARN
- NEW classifications of Recognized, Exemplary or Master
- Awards up to 10,000 and after TIG goes away, school districts will be obligated to raise the teachers base salary by the amount of the TIG
  - This is not prudent legislation in times of minimal increases to education
  - Morale will be destroyed if a district is in a pay freeze and the TIG is only awarded to a small group of teachers
- One source has shared that Senator Mishler and other senators who came up with the TAG model are not interested in changing it
- SB 249 also wants to differentiate pay based on “market factors”

### SB 1 Property Tax Reform

- Current version moves all referenda to fall of even calendar years
- Some are lobbying for adding primaries of even numbered calendar years
- News media is picking up on the proposed 0% increase to MLGQ in year 1 which is going to hurt given recent inflation
- Recent caps which limit growth in operations funds has been manageable but a freeze given some already known increases will squeeze our budget
- Budget cuts in an industry like ours that is people centered will result in curtailing services to the students we serve
- Schools in our region are facing a 17.2% NIPSCO increase over two years beginning in November 2025
- Most supplies including paper and cleaning products have also gone up and school buses are up 25% over the past couple of years
- Half of the session left and we will continue to ask our representatives for some support as we face rising costs

### SB 518 Property tax Sharing with Brick and Mortar Charter Schools

- Any school district that adopts a resolution to seek property tax levy after 5.10.25 must share proceeds with charter schools if the district has over 100 students attending brick and mortar charter schools
- Phasing in during 2008, school districts must also share other operations funds generated through property tax with brick and mortar charter schools

- While there may be an argument, (though I disagree with it) for sharing some of these funds with charter schools, there are two glaring problems that appear in need of clarification:
  - Why are schools sharing debt service levies with other schools when the levy is set to pay for the exact amount of the building loan? Why are the districts sharing the proceeds when this would mean the public district would not have enough to cover principal and interest on the debt that was issued for a specific purpose/building?
  - Have Indiana taxpayers been sufficiently informed that charter schools, with poor histories of fiscal responsibility will receive proceeds from on city or town's taxation even if they are located in a different city/town?

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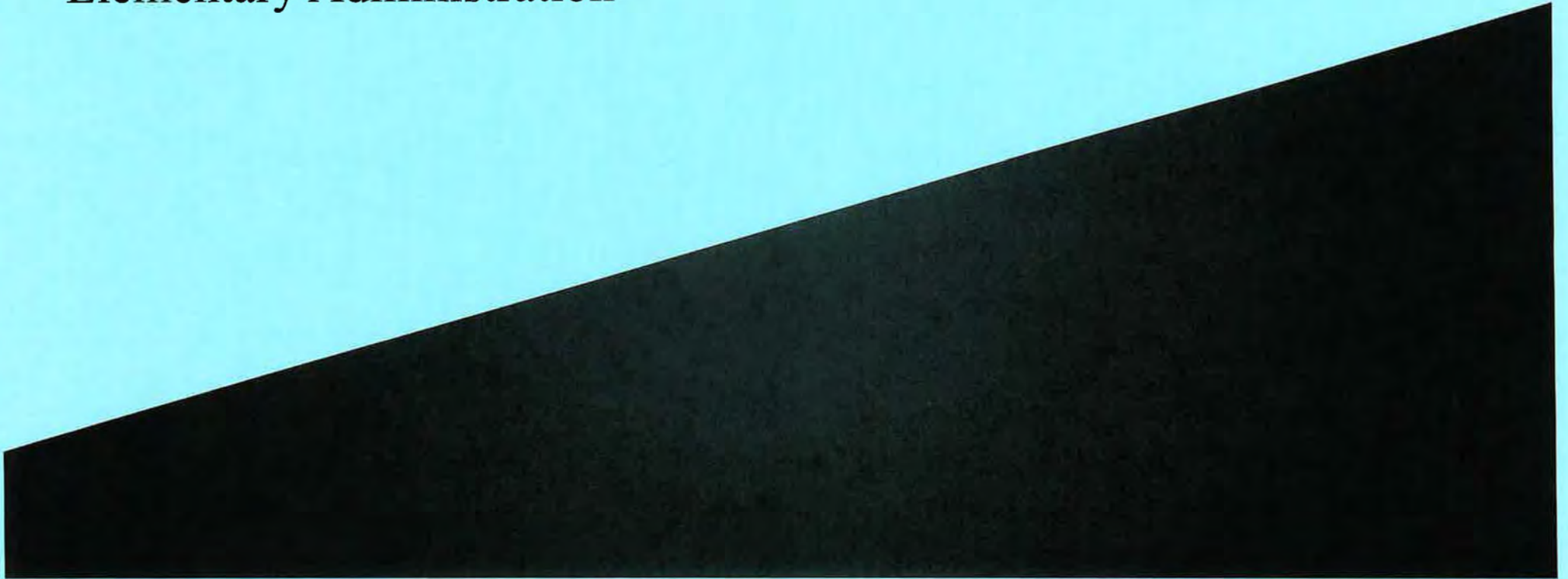
### **FIELD TRIP REQUESTS**

# Senate Bill 1

Senate Bill 1, which was passed by lawmakers and signed by the Governor of Indiana in March 2024, requires students be retained in grade three if they have not received a passing score on the IREAD-3 evaluation. Although we do agree that foundational reading skills are fundamental, the decision to retain third grade students based solely on IREAD-3 performance **was not a decision made or supported by the Lake Central School Corporation**. While in some cases retention may be appropriate, we believe that students who are progressing adequately or who demonstrate proficiency on similar local assessments should be promoted to 4th grade.

Effective the 2024-25 school year, the State of Indiana has decided that any child who does not pass IREAD-3 will be retained in 3rd grade. **The Lake Central Schools cannot stress enough how much we disagree with this rule.** There are some exemptions, which we will discuss during this presentation.

## Good Cause Exemptions

**PLEASE NOTE:** The student must continue to receive intensive interventions and progress monitoring aligned with the science of reading. **The student will continue to participate in the IREAD retest until they pass or are promoted to grade seven.**

## **FY 2025 Funding per ADM**

The Indiana Department of Education has finalized the school funding formula computations for fiscal year 2025. These calculations were made based on the State's current budget allocation for K-12 Education. I will discuss the data with the board during the meeting.

## **ADM Update**

In your board packet, I have provided the Board with a summary of our February '25 ADM count and how each building compares to the September '24 count conducted in the fall.

## Analysis of FY 2025 School Funding per ADM

1. School Funding Level (K-12 statewide): \$7,860,000,000 for FY 2022; \$8,200,000,000 for FY 2023; \$8,840,000 for FY 2024; and \$9,030,000 for FY 2025.
2. The highest Funding per ADM increased by \$90 from \$9,173 to \$9,263.
3. The lowest Funding per ADM increased by \$92 from \$6,632 to \$6,724.
4. The difference between the highest funded and the lowest funded was \$3,076 in FY 2018; \$2,768 in FY 2019; \$2,428 in FY 2020; \$2,444 in FY 2021; \$2,381 in FY 2022; \$2,403 in FY 2023; \$2,541 in FY 2024; and is \$2,539 now in FY 2025
5. 40 of the top 47 funded school corporations are charter schools.
6. The Statewide Average increased \$94 from \$7,374 to \$7,468. The Statewide Average had increased by \$363 from FY23 to FY24. The average funding for a charter school is \$8,041 (up \$82); however, it is only \$7,302 (up \$98) for a traditional public school.
7. Legislation was passed during the 2023 session requiring traditional public schools to siphon Operating Referendum dollars received from local taxpayers to charter schools, even if the charter school was not located within their school boundaries. However, there is talk of amending this so the dollars would only go to charter schools located within our school boundaries.
8. Lake Central's Funding per ADM increased from \$6,851 in FY 2024 to \$6,924 in FY 2025 (up \$94; 1.37%. From FY23 to FY24 it was up \$342; 5.25%).
9. In FY 2024 and FY2025, Lake Central's funding is ranked 341<sup>st</sup> out of 374 school corps. Therefore, we are in the lowest 9%.
10. Lake Central's funding is \$523 lower than the Statewide Average in FY 2025 (same as FY 2024).
11. Currently, all five 'Virtual Charter Schools' (no building; all online) receive per pupil funding higher than Lake Central.
12. Even though we have seen increased K-12 funding each of the last budget cycles, the State is forcing many districts to go to taxpayers for Operating Referendums in order to keep quality programs and give teachers the pay increases they deserve. The last three years have also seen above average inflationary rates.

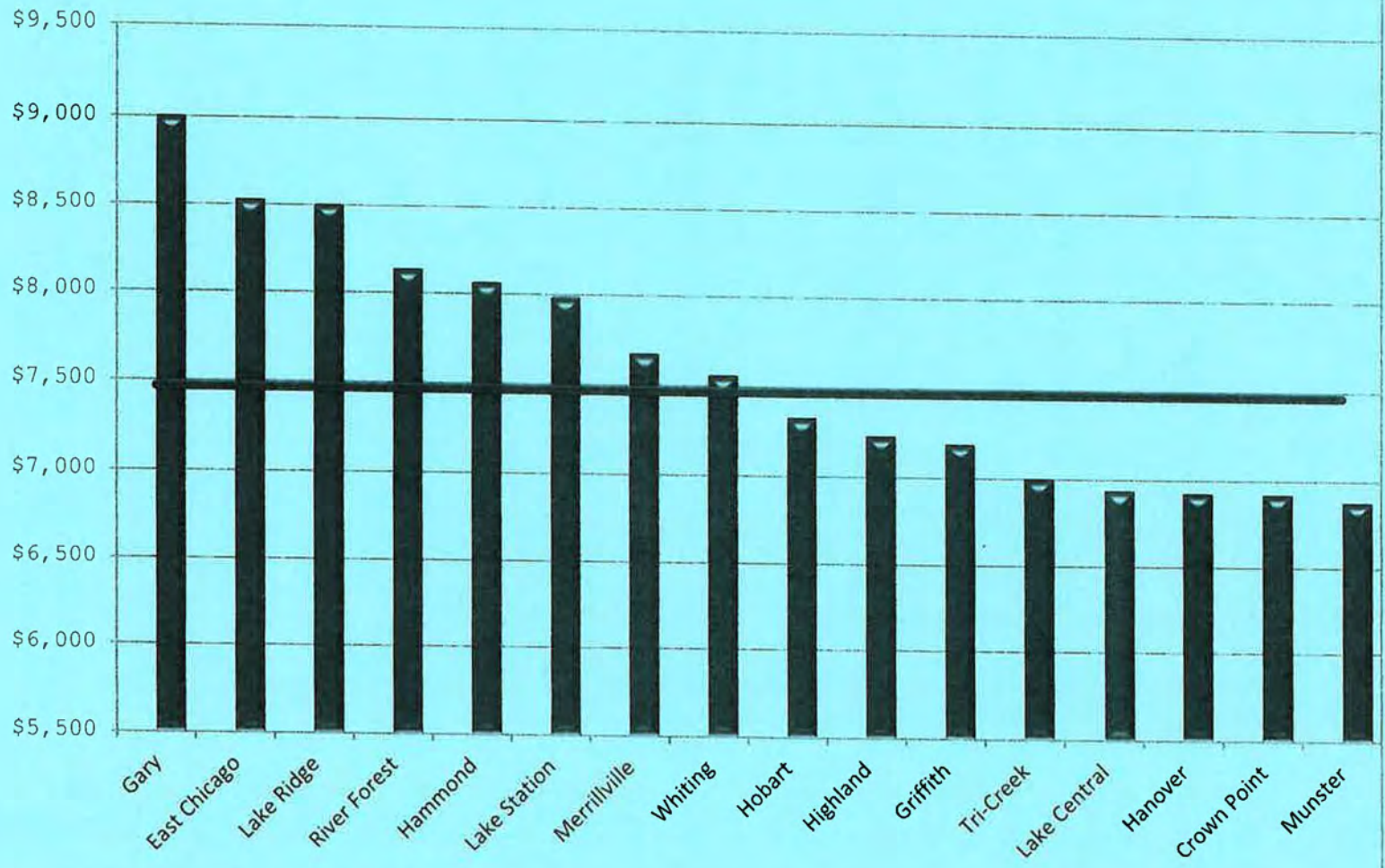

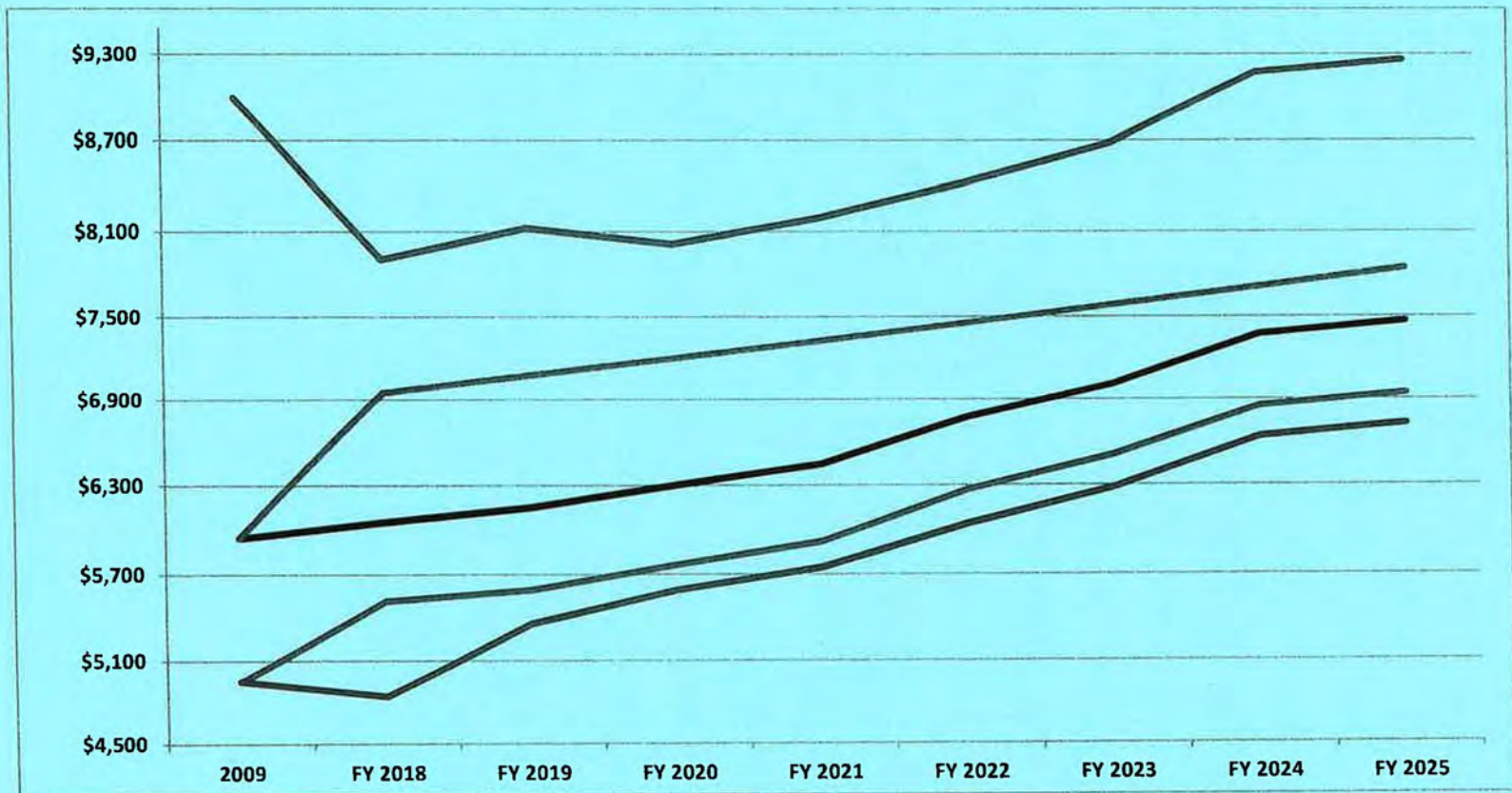
