Principal's Message: Standardized Testing

I am no longer a young man, but I am young enough to be considered a Millennial. I was born in 1982. Growing up, standardized testing became normal. I had to take ISTEP in high school. I also took the PSAT, SAT, and ACT all before heading off to college. In order to be a teacher, I had to take standardized assessments called the Praxis 1 and the Praxis 2. The GRE was taken before Graduate School and then finally a Principal's Licensure Exam. That's one example of a career pathway influenced by standardized tests, but any career will involve skills based assessments. Our goal at Grimmer Middle School is to prepare our students to be successful in a world of testing.

We begin ILEARN testing on April 24. We have been conducting required practice tests to get students familiar with the testing platform. Our message to students is to simply give their best effort. We cannot control the test, but we can control our attitude towards the test. We have spread the testing out based on IDOE guidance and successful past experiences. It will take longer to complete the tests, but students shouldn't feel so maxed out each day.

We could really use your support with ILEARN. Please talk with and encourage your child to give their best effort. Remind them to charge their Chromebooks the night before. A good night's sleep usually leads to a good day at school. Breakfast is always important. We have breakfast in the cafeteria if kids need it. We also have granola bars, life-savers, and jolly ranchers if students need a snack during a long morning of testing. At Grimmer, we really try to focus on things we can control in order to be successful. You may hear your child talk about a 2 hour delay schedule on the mornings of testing. We are not on a 2 hour delay. We are testing in the morning so the rest of the classes run that schedule the remainder of the day.

We are planning an end of the year celebration for all students to celebrate how hard everyone worked on ILEARN along with the school year in general. We are tentatively planning a day at Stevens Park with a cookout and some fun events including a DJ. As we nail down specifics, I'll follow up with more details. We know our students are working hard, and we want to celebrate that. Hang in there! We are almost to the finish line of the 2022-23 school year. My door is open if you need anything.
