

Congratulations to the Kahler/Grimmer dance team on bringing home two State Championships in Pom and Hip Hop!





The 7th Grade book club will be held on Thursday, April 13, 2023 in Room 178. Please stop by and see Ms. Rose in the library to pick up your copy now. The book we will be discussing is *It's Trevor Noah: Born a Crime* (Adapted for Young Readers).

Trevor Noah, the funny guy who hosts The Daily Show, shares his remarkable story of growing up in South Africa, with a black South African mother and a white European father at a time when it was against the law for a mixed-race child like him to exist. But he did exist--and from the beginning, the often-misbehaved Trevor used his keen smarts and humor to navigate a harsh life under a racist government. This compelling memoir blends drama, comedy, and tragedy to depict the day-to-day trials that turned a boy into a young man.



The Eighth Grade book club will be held on March 31, 2023. The book we will be discussing is *The War That Saved My Life* by Kimberly Brubaker Bradley; it is historical fiction. Here is a synopsis below.

Ten-year-old Ada has never left her one-room apartment. Her mother is too humiliated by Ada's twisted foot to let her outside. So when her little brother Jamie is shipped out of London to escape the war, Ada doesn't waste a minute—she sneaks out to join him. Evacuated from London to the English countryside during World War II, where they find life to be much sweeter away from their abusive mother.


