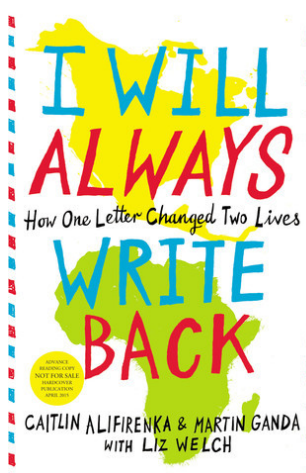


PBIS Field Trip Information:

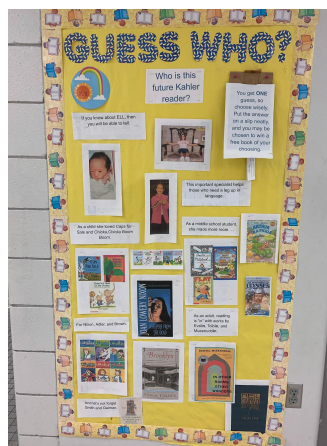

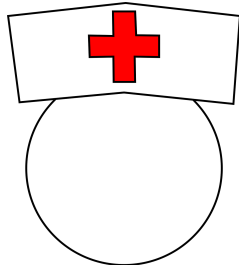
