BOYS TRACK: Last night our boys' track team put on an outstanding meet against a solid Pierce squad. The meet came down to the last event—the 1600 relay. The squad of Xavier Arambula, JC Baxter, Blake Hambleton, and Logan Bluett put a 4:05 time on the board—a season best—to guarantee the win for the Kolts 57 to 47. But even more impressive was the Kolts "B" team of Jackson Bosma, Brigham Redhead, Hunter Sabador, and Logan Scheisler. They not only defeated Pierce's "A" squad, but challenged the Kolts "A" squad for much of the race, including taking the lead over them for parts of the race.

Just too many personal records and to mention today, but a few of note include: Outstanding performances included:

- **1600 sweep** by JC Baxter, Julian Gomez, Brigham Redhead, and Noey Melgoza
- **The throwers squad** of Chris Walker-Grant, Eddie, Ramos, Jackson Smit, Ben Lopez, Joey Beckett, Joseph Garner, and Easton Termunde have come on strong with huge improvements. But the big question is who among these will be the first to break 30 foot in the shot or 90 foot in the discus.
- **400 Dash** win by Logan Bluett in 57 seconds with [Blake Hambleton](#) in 3rd. Ethan Kosick also ran a solid race.
- **Hurdlers** Blake Hambleton, Daniel Capehart, and Josh Arambula all finished in 18 seconds or faster—very impressive times.

- **Sprinters** Homze Wadhah and Jose Serra Acevedo matched Pierce's best in the 100 & 200.
- **800 had runners** JC Baxter, Xavier Arambula, Brigham Redhead, Logan Schiesler, Julian Gomez and Vince Alegria dominate the top finish spots. Many, many personal records set.

Official results will be sent out to the team once they are in. Ribbons to be passed out at today's practice (and the weather is looking great).

GIRLS TRACK: Girls Track lost a close race against Pierce last night with a score of 51 to 54. We have not received any official results or times but a couple highlights of the night were:

1600 meter - stellar performances by Madison Gifford, Addie Coughlin, and Hannah Middleton

 4x100 team of Lief, Watters, Rivera, and Fairris broke the school record once again and we are inching towards the 51 sec mark.
