What is Dual Credit?

Dual credit is the term given to courses in which high school students have the opportunity to earn both high school <u>and</u> college credits at low cost.

Dual credit courses are taught by high school teachers.

An agreement must be made between secondary and post-secondary schools to establish dual credit partnerships. Currently, each post-secondary school has different requirements for acceptance, teacher requirements and curriculum.

Indiana's Core Transfer Library

What is the CTL?

To enable you to transfer college credits, Indiana has developed the Core Transfer Library (CTL) – a list of courses that will transfer among all Indiana public college and university campuses, assuming adequate grades.

All Core Transfer Library courses will meet the general education <u>or</u> free elective requirements of undergraduate degree programs, and a significant majority of CTL courses will also count as one-on-one equivalents to courses taught at your new campus.

Core Transfer Library (continued)

The requirements for most associate's and bachelor's degree programs include general or free electives which can be satisfied by taking courses you choose. Credit hours generated by courses listed in the CTL will satisfy these requirements, up to the credit hour limit set for the particular degree program.

For example, a student enrolled in a bachelor's degree program requiring nine semester hours of electives may select any three, three-credit courses listed in the CTL, from any public campus, to meet this requirement.

Who Can Enroll in a Dual Credit Class?

All students can take a class designated "dual credit "class for high school credit (some are LCHS graduation requirements). However, students who elect to register for the dual credit must qualify to take part in the dual credit component of the class. The requirements are based on the post-secondary school.





Introduction

Congratulations for choosing to pursue dual credit at Lake Central High School! Dual credit is the term given to courses in which high school students have the opportunity to earn both high school and college credits. LCHS dual credit courses are taught by regular high school faculty with support from a university faculty member. In most cases, the courses have the same syllabus and/or assessments as the college course being offered on campus. Successfully completing dual credit courses is one of the best predictors of success for students in attaining a four-year degree.

High School Diploma Type / Core Transfer Library

Students wishing to complete the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma may use dual credit (as specified below) as one of several options. Students wishing to complete the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma, must complete the following coursework:

- * Complete all the requirements for Core 40.
- * Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits.
- * Earn 6-8 Core 40 world language credits.
- * Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.
- * Earn a grade of a 'C' or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- * Have a grade point average of 'B' or above.
- * Complete one of the following:
- a) Complete AP courses (4 credits) and corresponding AP exams
- b) Complete IB (Higher Level) courses (4 credits) and corresponding IB exams.
- c) Earn a combined score of 1200 or higher on the SAT critical reading and mathematics
- d) Score a 26 or higher composite on the ACT
- e) Complete dual high school/college credit courses from the Core Transfer Library (6 transferable college credits)
- f) Complete a combination of AP courses (2 credits) and corresponding AP exams and dual high school/ college credit course(s) from the Core Transfer Library (3 transferable college credits)

Many of the courses offered for dual credit at LCHS are part of the Indiana Core Transfer Library (CTL). To enable students to transfer college credits, the state of Indiana has developed the Core Transfer Library (CTL) which is a list of courses that will transfer among all Indiana public college and university campuses, assuming a student has adequate grades.




Once you are approved for dual credit by the university, you will receive payment information from the university (excluding by Tech which is tuition free). The cost per credit at PUC and PNC is \$98.12 per credit hour* (most courses are 3 credits). That same course offered on the university campus has an average cost of \$202.30 per credit hour (plus student fees/books). After completing the application process in RDS parent/student access and/or the university website, students will be subjected to deadlines for drop/add and payment set by the university. Students must drop/add courses by going to the Request Dual Credit Enrollment and Withdrawal Screen in RDS parent/student access. Grades earned by students will be reflected on both high school and college transcripts.
