Welcome back and Happy New Year! I hope that you had a safe and happy holiday season.



Language Arts Department:

As we approach the second nine weeks, Language Arts classes will be studying new units. To help promote these units and extend them beyond the classroom, we encourage you to discuss the following essential questions with your child at the dinner table, on the way to a practice or game, or whenever you have an opportunity.

5th Grade

- 1. What is the difference between fact and opinion?
- 2. How can people's differences of opinion lead to a revolution?
- 3. What words are used in a text to express an opinion?

6th Grade

- 1. How do individuals react when dealing with disaster?
- 2. How do people deal with and explain the impact of damaging events?

7th Grade

- 1. How do I step outside of my own perceptions and to allow myself to look at a situation objectively?
- 2. How are people's perceptions shaped?

8th Grade

- 1. At what point do you transition from childhood to adulthood?
- 2. How do major economic events change and/or influence your life?
- 3. How can lack of communication interfere with the relationship between you and your parents?

AR Field Trip

The Language Arts AR field trip will take place on May 16th (for 5th and 6th graders) and May 17 (for 7th and 8th graders) at Jak's Warehouse. Students who meet 100% of their AR goals for the first three grading periods will be allowed to attend. The cost of the trip will be \$25 and includes unlimited attractions, a \$10 arcade game card, plus two slices of pizza and a drink.

Northwestern University's Midwest Talent Search (NUMATS) is a program that assists in identifying and meeting the needs of high ability students in the Midwestern states. If your child has scored in the 95th percentile of a nationally normed test or PASS + on the ISTEP MATH OR READING last year, and they are now a 7th or 8th grader, you may want to consider having your child take the SAT or ACT. 
