From the Desk of Principal: Scott Graber

Wow! It is amazing how fast the school year is flying by. Incredibly, within a month, the 2017-2018 school year will be over. As we approach the end of the year, please remember to keep communication lines open with the teachers, guidance counselors, and administration if you are having a problem or concern. We are here to assist and help you!

As the year winds down, please continue to check the school website for a host of activities that will be taking place. From band and choir banquets and concerts, Riley's Dodge ball tournament, Shake-speare's birthday bash, to boys' and girls' track meets, orientation for incoming 4th grade students, AR field trip to Zao Island, 5th grade *Drugs R Dangerous* program, and Unified Special Olympic day at the high school, there are many things still to accomplish in six weeks. Please make an effort to attend some of these events, if you are able. The website will list the times for these events.

Round 2 of the ISTEP testing window is from April 16-May 4. I ask that you plan ahead and make it a point to have your child in attendance daily. It is very difficult to try and schedule make-up tests for a school that has an enrollment of over 1,100 students. If you can, please schedule appointments for after school hours,; it is greatly appreciated. Please remind your child to eat a good breakfast, get plenty of sleep, and be prepared to take the online tests.

During the month of March and April, students were given the opportunity to select their "specials class" for the 2018-2019 school year. If you did not see the slip of paper, which requires your signature, please check with your child. All students are required to take a semester of PE-Health/Digital Citizenship. For the upcoming year, students that are in grades 6-8, can take band or choir as an elective. This is a full-year class. Once you sign up for the full-year class, the expectation is that you remain in that class for the entire year. The other special would be PE-Health/Digital Citizenship. If your child decides that they do not want to take band or choir, then your child would take the rotation, which would include a semester of PE -Health, and a semester of Digital Citizenship, along with a semester of art and PLTW (Project Lead the Way). One other option is for your child to sign up to be a peer mentor and work with our students with special needs. This option would take the place of the art/PLTW rotation. If this interests your child, they must complete an application and turn it in to the main office. Unfortunately, we cannot accept every student that wants to be a peer mentor, as we have limited spots. If you have questions, please let us know. We are happy to assist you!

Congratulations to Mrs. Arroyo and the choir department as they also received GOLD ratings at ISSMA. Also, congratulations to Mr. Walton and the 6-8 grade band programs as they received GOLD ratings for their performance at ISSMA. We are very proud of you! Great Job! A special congratulations goes out to Yara Hijaz and Leah O'Connor, who earned a silver and a gold rating. These two young ladies were the only middle school students in the corporation that qualified for state. Great job with your ensemble!

Congratulations to Emilee Martin (1st Place) and Emily Denny (3rd Place) for their essays in the local V.F.W. Patriot Pen Essay Contest. Awesome Job! Emilee received a \$300 cash prize and Emily received a \$100.00 cash prize.

We recently completed our paper/pencil ISTEP testing. We are continuing to prepare the students for the second round of ISTEP testing April 16th through May 4th. This portion of the test will be computer based. The students will be using Chrome Books and computer labs in the building for testing. Grades 6-8 will be testing April 16th – April 19th, and Grade 5 will test April 23rd – April 27th. We appreciate your hard work and effort with having your children in school during the testing windows. Thank you for your continued support in these areas.

Be mindful of our new safety drills and language that we are using in our buildings. We continue to run drills with our local authorities to allow them to become familiar with our building. An email was sent to all parents regarding this standard response protocol for students and teachers through the I Love U Guys Foundation.

Thank you for your help when dropping your children off by door J on the south side; however, please be mindful of the following issues: (1) Please make sure that you remain in the car line, and do not allow your child to exit the vehicle until they are motioned out or told verbally to unload. (2) If you are parking your car, please use a proper parking spot and do not pull out into oncoming traffic or stop in the middle of the row. (3) The handicapped parking spots are needed for our students with disabilities, and we appreciate your help in keeping those spots available. (4) If you are escorting your child to door J, please use the cross-walk located by the three orange cones. Thank you for your help in this matter!


The 21st Century Scholarship application is available online at the following link. https://scholars.in.gov/students/grade-7-8.

To be considered for the scholarship, eligible students MUST enroll by <u>JUNE 30th of the 8th grade year</u>. Please review the eligibility guidelines on the website. Students enrolling will need to create a Scholars Track account and follow the Scholar Success Program each year during high school. 
THE SCHOLARSHIP

Earning the 21st Century Scholarship provides students up to four years of undergraduate tuition* at any participating public college or university in Indiana. If you attend a private college, the state will award an amount comparable to that of a four-year public college. If you attend a participating proprietary (for-profit) school, the state will award a tuition scholarship equal to that of Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana.

The Math department at Clark Middle has been getting ready for the last round of ISTEP. We have been doing multiple activities to be sure each child is ready and prepared for the test. Just because ISTEP tests are finishing up, does not mean the school year is over. Students still need to remember we have the rest of the nine weeks to finish. Check with your student to see if they are bringing home assignments and reviewing for tests and quizzes.

A reminder if extra help is needed, students can come to tutoring on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Tutoring is open for any student. Tutoring starts at 8:00 a.m. It is important that students bring questions or work that needs to be reviewed when coming to tutoring. As always, if there are any concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the student's teacher.





Any parent of next year's 7th or 8th graders, please be mindful of the following. Applications for potential new members will be given to students who have gualified to be a part of the National Junior Honor Society early second semester. While that is a long way off, there are a few items to keep in mind to ensure your student meets the requirements for membership. Students in the 7th and 8th grade must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.33 to receive an application. In order to become a member of the Clark Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society, members must complete the application and be selected by a faculty committee. Just getting and/or completing the application does not guarantee membership. Students must have at least two inschool and two out-of-school activities (these must be from 6th, 7th, or 8th grade) and write a one-page essay. For out-of-school activities, students need to have some sort of documentation to prove they were members. If signatures/proof of membership is not provided, it will **NOT** count as an activity. So for any summer programs, sports, activities, etc., please keep receipts, rosters, a letter from the sponsor/coach, etc. These might be hard to track down next spring if they happened in the summer, so keep it in mind now! In the fall, when call-out meetings are going on, please encourage your student to get involved! Membership cannot happen at the time of application and count towards their activities. Students must be in an activity for at least one semester or a full athletic season for the activity to count. Also, if a student plans to participate in track or other spring activity, they cannot count that as one of their activities since the season has not happened at the time of application.

In-school activities are those sponsored by Clark Middle School and/or Lake Central School Corporation. The following are examples of activities that count for membership in-school: Jazz Band, Swing Choir, **SOLO** ISSMA (not the group required for class), Chess Club, Friendship Club, Science Olympiad, Academic Superbowl, dance, cheer, sport teams, etc. The following activities **DO NOT** count: any classes (band, peer mentoring, office aid, etc.), babysitting, pet sitting, bake sales or other one-day fundraisers, races/color runs or other one-day events. **Any questions about activities can be directed to Mrs. Giannini at <u>mgiannin@lcscmail.com</u>.**






The last day of school is Friday, May 25th! School is in session for the full day.


PuppyGrams on March 20, 2018. The furry, stuffed puppies were a huge success and put a lot of smiles on the faces of our students and staff!
