

From the Desk of Principal: Scott Graber

Happy April. It is hard to believe that we are heading to the last stretch of the school year and I assure you, it will fly by very quickly. With that in mind, a huge thanks to our staff, parents and students for their continued help and support during the pandemic. Yes, as a school, we are still required to wear a mask, so if you are stopping by to drop off something or pick up an item, masks still must be worn.

During the school year, the students and staff have gone through a huge educational shift with eLearning, in person instruction, and then some switches back and forth due to medical or family issues. Please know that during this time, the staff has continued to provide your child with an education that, I am sure, looks very different from when we went to school. From CANVAS and Skyward, to uploading documents, to scanning and downloading, the shift in education has been tremendous. With all of these changes, we are starting to see a decline with some of our students educationally, emotionally, and socially. I am asking you to keep an eye on your child. Many children, not just at CMS, are facing a trend toward being isolated, depressed, and reluctant to talk or open up with adults and other students. This pandemic has taught us all a lot about perseverance, life, expectations, and daily challenges so let's work together and help each other as we embark on a new educational format. If your child is experiencing some issues related to isolation, depression, or struggling due to being at home (or at school) during the pandemic, please have them reach out to someone—a friend, their counselor, a teacher, or an administrator. Many of us have been using Google Meets to check up on students during this eLearning phase.

With May just around the corner, students tend to think school is over and they start to lag with their work. Within the last few weeks, CMS has started a new program called EXACT PATH. Students that are struggling in math and ELA may be required to attend this class which is focused on skills that they may be lacking. If students do not show progress, then they may be referred to summer school and/or be retained in their current grade. Education is too important to waste and we want all of the students at CMS to be challenged daily and do their very best.

The annual 8th grade awards ceremony will take place on May 28 beginning at 1:45pm in the gym. Parents, please review the information that I sent out via Alert Now messaging on April 5. Also, tickets for the ceremony will be given to the students on May 27. All students will be provided 2 tickets for the ceremony. If there are siblings that reside in the household, they may attend but only 2 tickets per student will be dispersed. We will have parameters in place to monitor the number of people entering the building. We are working with our technology department to live stream the ceremony to those that will not be able to attend. More information will be provided as the date gets closer.

All students will be required to return their chrome book/charger and any other school related materials that were used during the school year. More information will be forthcoming as to a return date for those items. Consumable textbooks will not be returned to the *continued on next page*

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school. For items that are not returned, a fine will be assessed for those materials.

Since this will be the last newsletter before school ends, I want to extend my sincere appreciation and thanks to everyone for a successful school year. For our 8th grade students moving on to high school—Good luck; to students that are moving on to other places to live—I wish you the best and am happy that part of your journey came through CMS; for those that are returning in the fall can't wait to see you back. The school year is flying by and it is hard to believe the students are in the fourth quarter! All eighth graders have completed their high school course requests in Skyward. The high school has begun work on the master schedule, and students will be notified sometime in May if their requested electives have conflicts. Alternate classes were also added in case students do not get a first choice elective class.

The counselors have continued to meet with groups of 8th graders during digital citizenship classes, and have used that time on career guidance activities and how personal interests and strengths can impact future decision making. Seventh graders will be working on determining what learning styles best suit their individual needs through a Learning Styles Inventory.

Information on dealing with bullying, resolving personal conflicts with others, and strategies to help one deal with anxiety and stress have been woven into Second Step lessons during advisory for grades 6-8th. Fifth grader advisories have been focusing on better ways to deal with stressful situations, respecting others and self, and making healthy choices. The social emotional learning that is taking place in advisory helps the counselors as they work with students in smaller groups and individually.

All 5th grade students should have turned in their form for the elective they are choosing for next year (Band, Choir, or Tech/Art). If Band or Choir was not selected, students will be placed into the Tech/Art classes. Sixth and 7th grades will be placed in the section they were enrolled in this school year for next year. If your child does not want to continue in the current elective (band or choir) please notify the office ASAP.

The counselors are available to assist students with academic, social or personal issues they may be experiencing. Please encourage your child to seek out assistance as needed.


