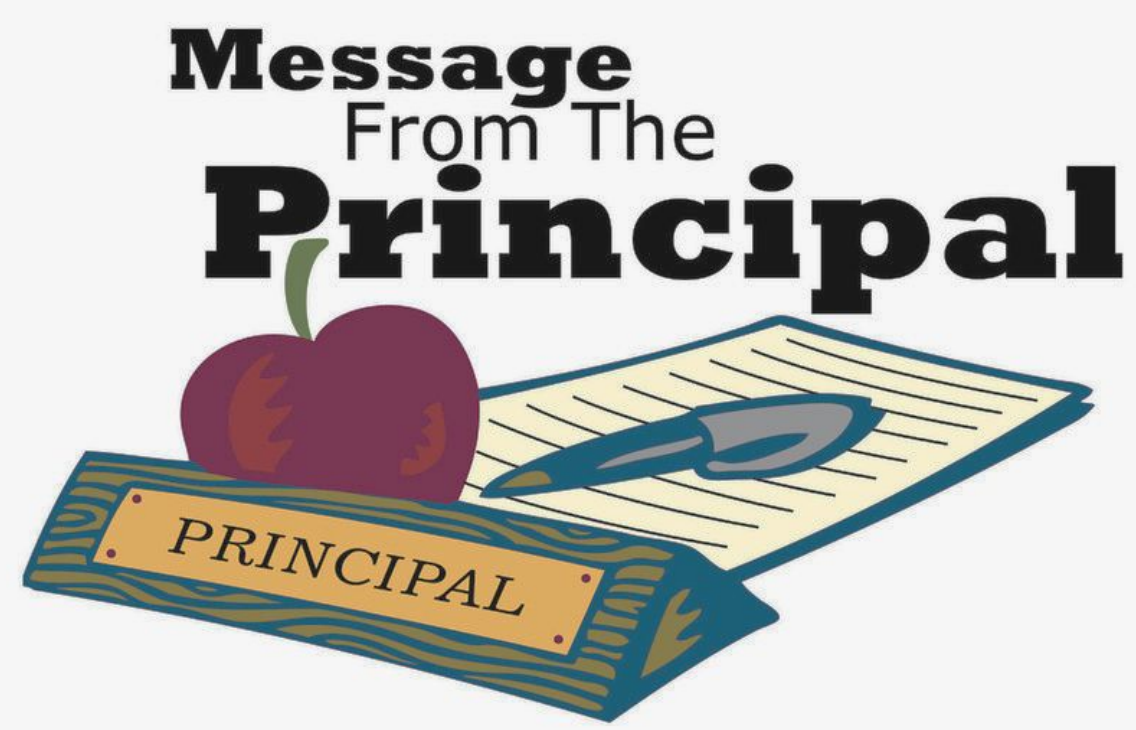
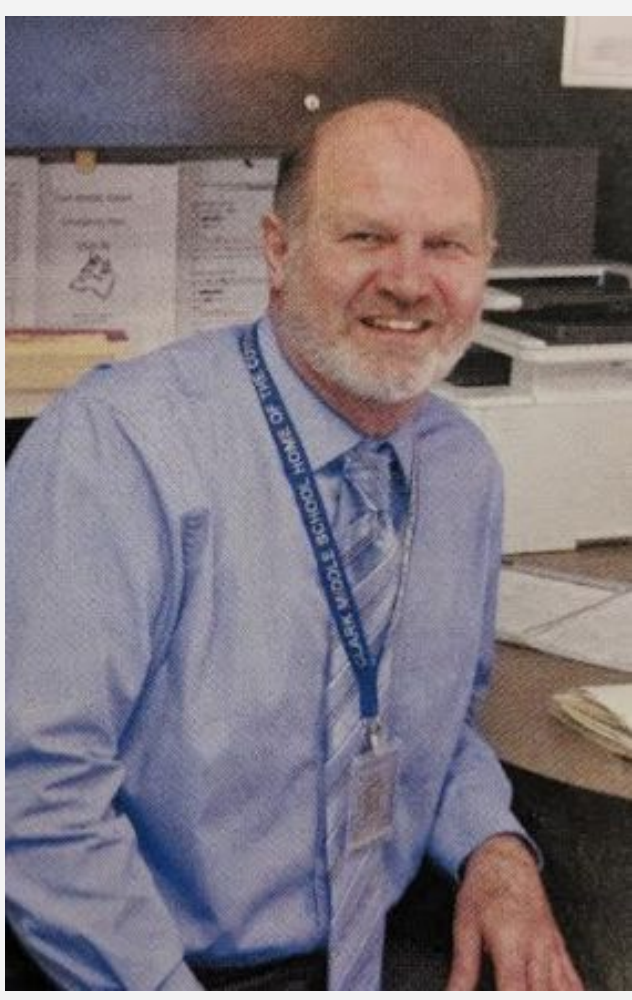

The second semester is in full swing. Hopefully, the snow and ice storms are behind us and the beautiful sounds of nature are just around the corner. As with every year, this season of school can be very difficult for many of our students as there is more to do with spring approaching, summer around the corner, and the anticipation of no more school for a couple of months...trust me, I get it. However, it is important to note that school does not end until May 23 unless there is a snow day or the year gets extended. With that in mind, please remember the following items when sending your child to CMS:

- It's not Spring yet, so let's leave the shorts at home
- The blouses must be long enough so that we are unable to see skin
- The shorts need to be fingertip length
- Spaghetti straps are not allowed unless covered by a sweater or jacket
- Phones need to remain in the locker or in a backpack—not on the person
- It's ok to wear a jacket to school when it's only 15 degrees outside
- All shirts must have sleeves
- Pants are not allowed to have holes above the knees

With this small list of items, it helps out tremendously if you can remind your child(ren) about daily expectations at school. I appreciate your help with the above items.

Communication continues to be one of the most important facets that keep our lines open between students, staff, and parents. If you have a concern, please do not wait until it has festered and then there is hostility or frustration...call the school; contact a teacher, counselor, or an administrator and let's meet to resolve whatever the concern or issue might be. In most situations, it's possibly a misunderstanding or miscommunication between the parties. Feel free to contact me as well if you need to discuss an issue or you feel that you are not being heard. I am here to support your child(ren) daily within the school environment. As the law says, "in loco parentis" which means that as principal, I have to make the best decision "in place of parent" everyday while they are under my supervision at CMS.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS----The yearly state-mandated test, ILEARN and IAM, will be taking place from April 18-May 13. Currently, our plan is to begin testing on April 19 and finish up the following week. Students will be testing the first 3 hours of the day, so if at all possible, PLEASE try and have your child at school every day and on time during the testing window. Students need to be in their assigned classrooms by 8:47 daily. The state prohibits smartwatches or cell phones in the testing sessions; students that are caught with cell phones or smartwatches in the testing area will be subject to disciplinary measures as this constitutes an irregularity and a violation of the testing protocols. Therefore, all students and staff must keep their cell phones in their lockers or backpacks (outside of the classroom) during the testing sessions. Please remind your child about this important issue with testing... Naturally, as principal, I will be making daily announcements in advance of the testing sessions and the teachers will also be reminding the students as well.

Thanks to our PTO for their continued support this year. The students and staff appreciate the extra water that has been provided this year. If you are able to make a donation of water, please drop it off in the main office. You might be surprised at the amount of water that is consumed by almost 1100 students and 130 support staff over the course of a few weeks. Again, thank you!!

Over the past few weeks, the administration and counselors have been meeting with students that are on the probation list. As a reminder, students that fail 2 or more classes may be recommended to attend summer school and/or be retained if their grades are not where they should be. All students can receive tutoring help from staff on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 8:00-8:30 without charge. Students can attend any class where additional help or clarification is needed in regard to an assignment. If possible, please drop your child off if they need extra help on tutoring days.

Middle school scheduling will take place during the month of March for the students in grades 5, 6, 7. Students will be selecting their “special classes” for the following year. If a student is interested in being a peer mentor or office aide, an application will be coming out soon. Students that are selected as a peer mentor or office aide will only have 1 special. Once the forms are available, the staff at CMS stick to a very firm deadline so please remind your child to listen for the announcements and submit their form if interested. Students that are currently enrolled in band or choir will remain in that special for the 2022-2023 school year unless we receive notice that they wish to drop out of the class. More information will be on the announcements and on the school website soon.

Congratulations to all the students who participated in ISSMA!! Clark was well represented and had numerous students receive scores in the GOLD range.

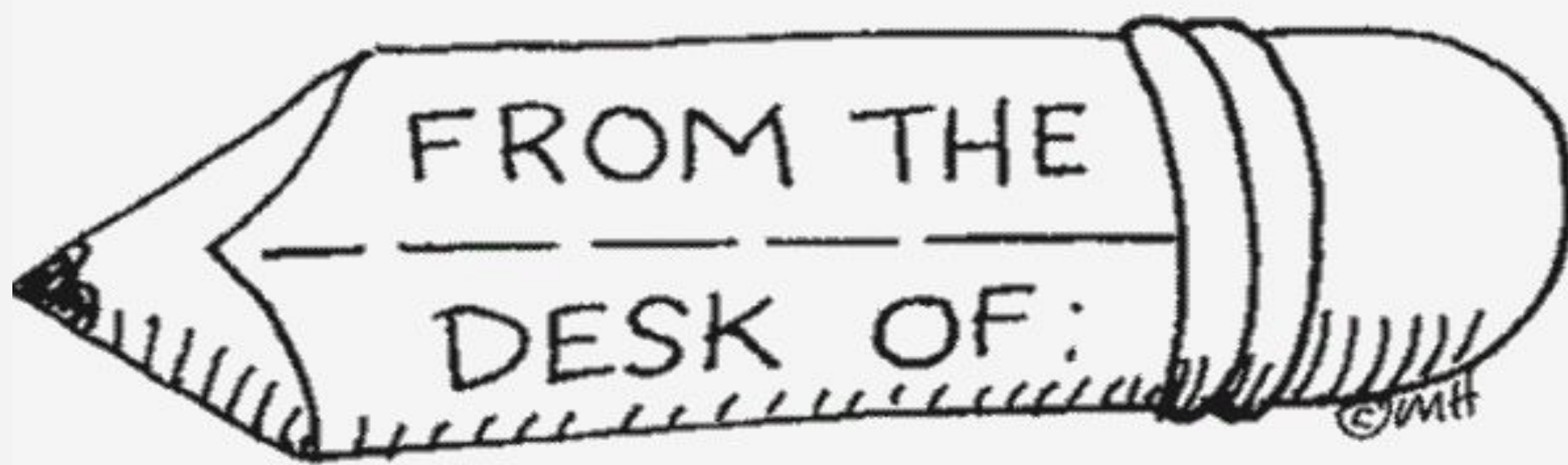

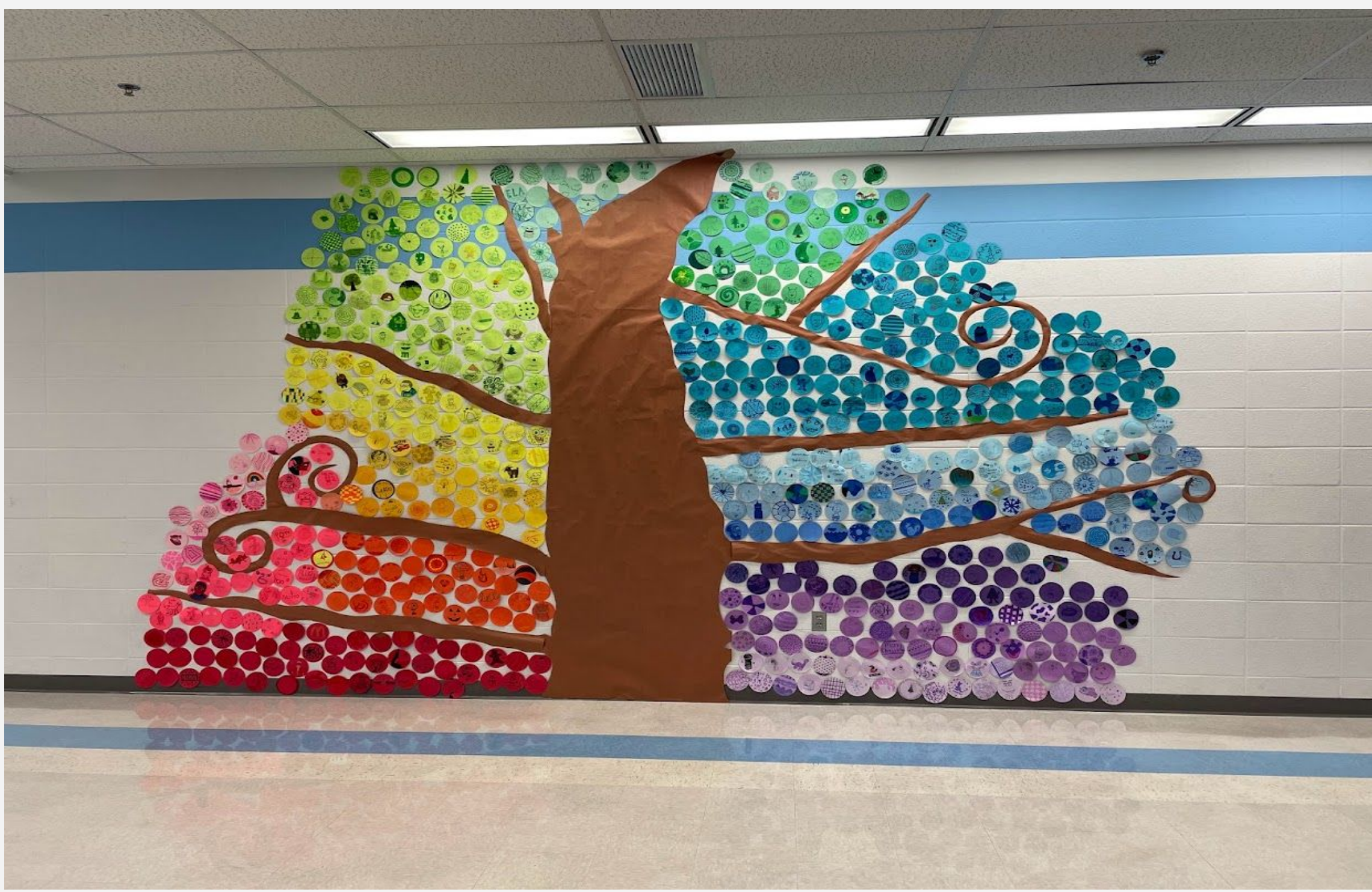

As always, please reach out to your students' counselor with any questions or concerns!

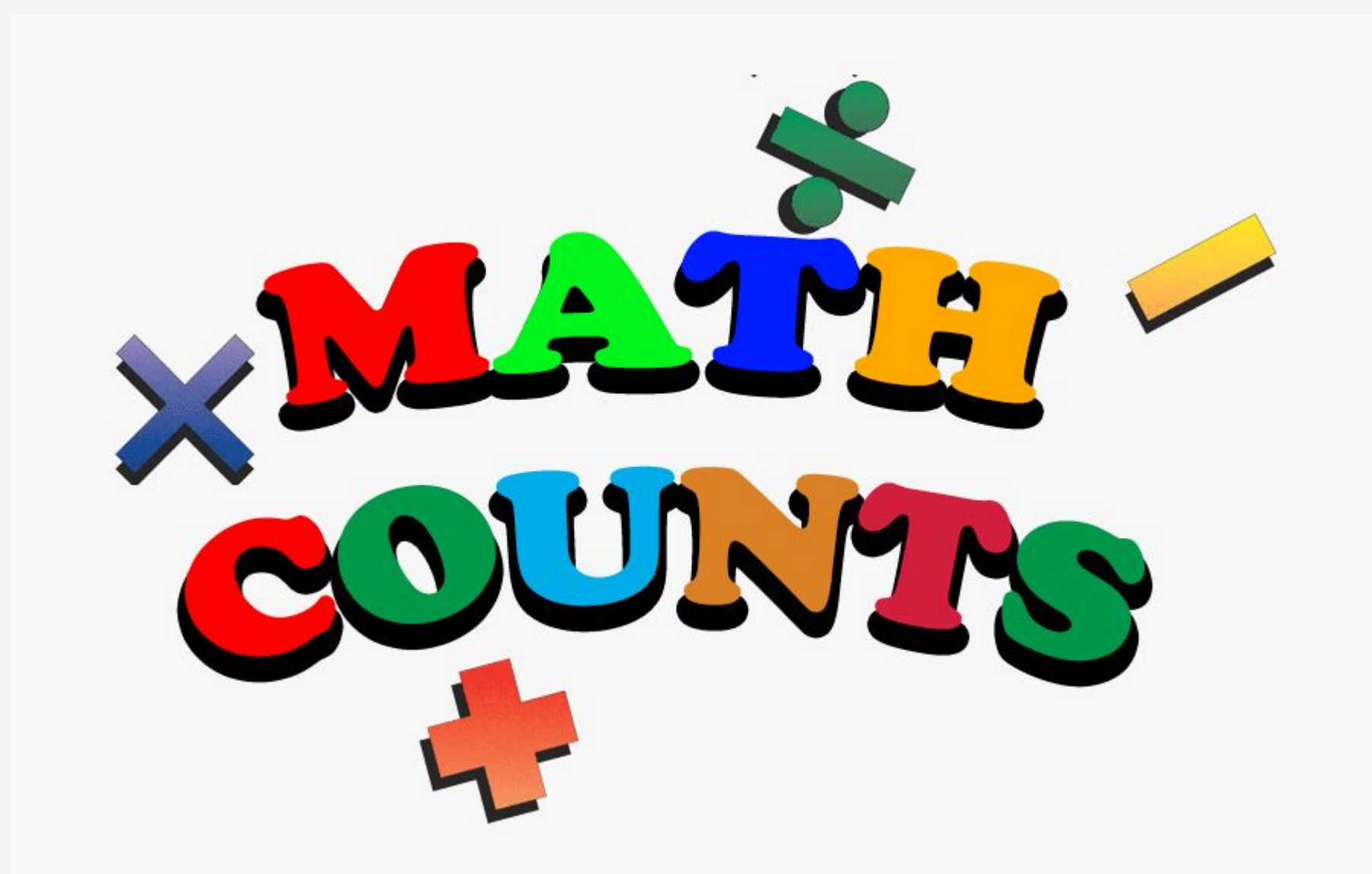


Community Tree

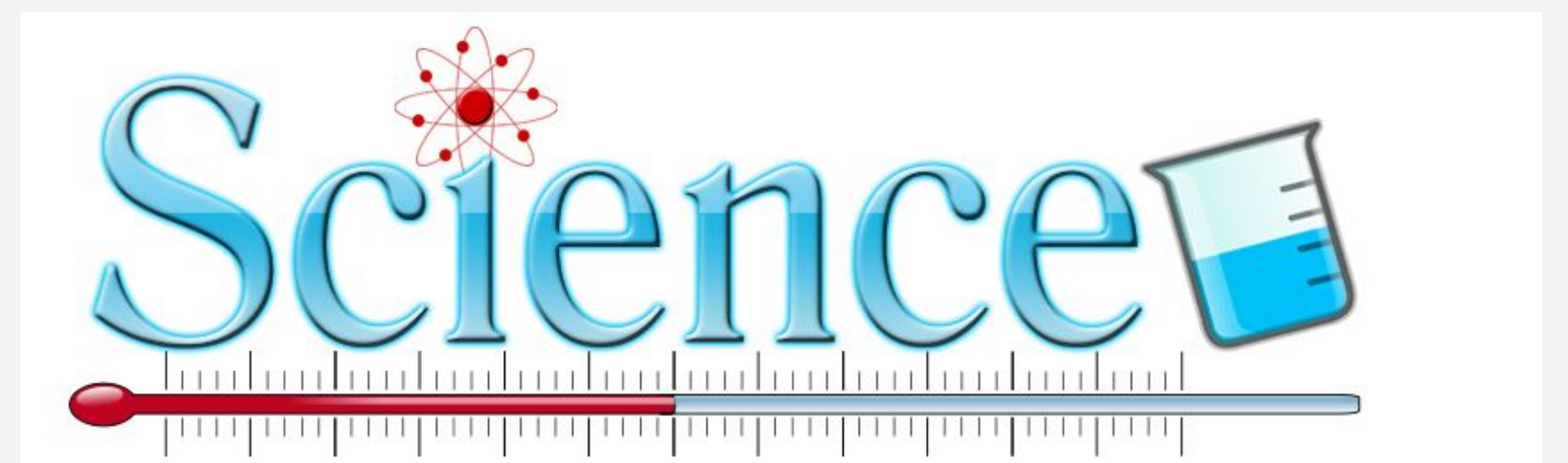

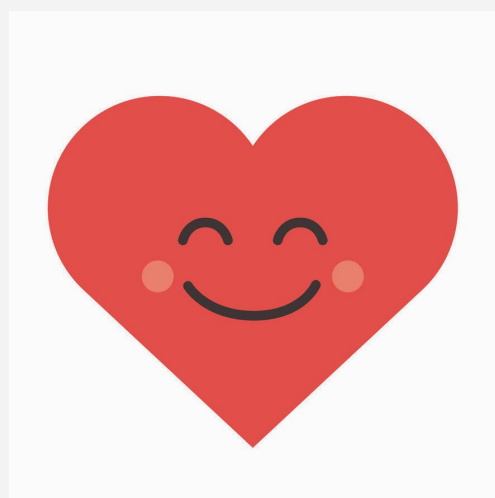

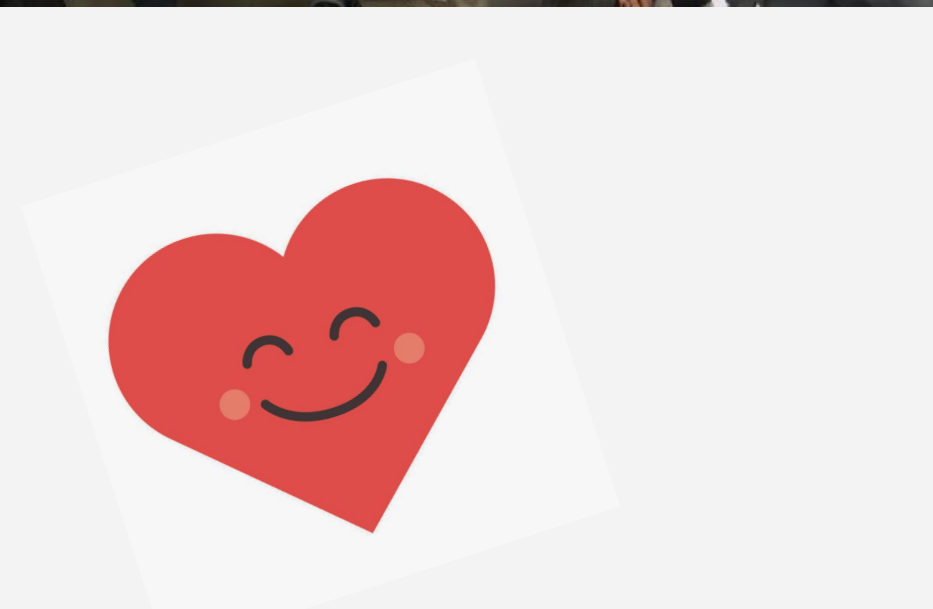

They had 30 minutes to figure out the best way to clean the feathers in the water which mimicked many of the birds that were in the water during the oil spill, in addition to figuring out how to clean the oil (cocoa powder & oil mixture) out of the water using the supplies they were given. They learned about different STEM jobs that such as environmental engineers & then later found out that Mrs. Beach's husband helped clean up the Bp Oil spill!
