







Happy summer to you! I hope this newsletter finds you enjoying your summer break. As we look to school starting in just a few weeks, I want to "Welcome" you to Clark Middle School—Home of the Coyotes! For our returning students, I hope that you have been enjoying the time away from school. For our incoming students, the halls of CMS await you with anticipation. We look forward to our new students joining us this year.

As we embark on a new year, I am confident that you will see your child challenged this year. One of the concerns that I face as principal is parents waiting to reach out to the staff or me if there is an issue. Please do not wait...if there is a problem or concern, please reach out to the teacher first, and then follow up with an administrator. Many times, I hear the following statement from parents..." Oh, well, I didn't want to bother you because I know you are busy." Trust me, I would rather work with you to solve the problem than find out after an issue has been going on for several weeks. Feel free to contact your child's teachers, guidance counselor or one of the administrators—we are here for you.

Students will have access again this year to a chromebook. Students will be able to bring it home nightly but please make sure that, as a parent, you monitor what they are doing. Students will need to make sure that their chromebook is charged and ready for the next day at school as well as bringing their charger back and forth with them daily. The use of the chromebook is for EDUCATIONAL purposes only. In addition, if a child damages their chromebook, i.e. breaking the screen, missing keys, writing or drawing on them, losing them, or breaking another student's chromebook, they could be charged. Student are reminded to not share their assigned chromebook with other students. Please encourage your child to be responsible for this educational device.

Cell phones are an excellent way of communicating or obtaining information; however, in the middle school, we ask that students do **NOT** bring them to school. If there is an emergency, one of the administrative staff will contact you with our Alert Now messaging system. Over the past years, we have found that students do not understand the dangers of being on a device, especially if they use certain apps such as Instagram, TikTok, YouTube, Snapchat, Discord, etc. If your child is involved in inappropriate activities with a cell phone and another student outside of school, the parents have the right to contact the police department and file a report. In regard to the school standpoint, the administration will be involved if the issue is affecting the educational welfare of the CMS students. In addition, our School Resource Officer, Officer Nick Stamate, will assist if necessary. So, in summary, please have your child leave their cell phone at home this year.

Backpacks are a great way for students to carry their belongings, but, backpacks will need to be kept in the student's locker. Students have 5 minutes to get to each class period, which is plenty of time. The expectation for ALL students is that they should be in their assigned classroom prior to the bell sounding.

<u>We welcome new staff members</u> Stephanie Rosenwinkel (5th grade) and Megan Adams(special education). I am excited to add these talented teachers to our staff. We look forward to getting to know them and welcome them aboard. More information on them to come!

<u>Medical information....</u> if your child has specific doctor's orders, please make sure that we have an updated copy of the orders PRIOR to the school starting. If the doctor does NOT specify an order to be done at school, legally, we cannot do the treatment or honor a parent's request. Feel free to reach out to our school nurses, Mrs.

**SKYWARD REGISTRATION info**...Parents...please make sure to fill out the enrollment/registration forms in its entirety. Emergency contacts need be to be updated with accurate phone numbers in case your child needs to be picked up due to a health or disciplinary issue. If the person's name is not listed as a contact, we cannot release your child to them. Also, please provide updated court documents if there is a divorce or restraining order so that we can provide the best safety for your child. Schedules will be available online beginning August 7<sup>th</sup> at 9:00am.

The open building date for students to come to school and check out their lockers, walk the building, meet the office staff, go through their daily schedule is listed below. If you do not have access to print out your schedule prior to coming to CMS for the open building dates, please feel free to stop by the main office and obtain a copy!

#### Open Building Day, August 10<sup>th</sup> from 10:00am until 6:00pm.

On August 10, the office staff, nurses, counselors and administrators will be available to assist you with any questions, drop off medications, talk with staff, or answer any question that you might have regarding Clark Middle School. Also, our Athletic Director, Mrs. Lori Smith, will be available for parents and/or students that have questions about our athletic program.

<u>Interested in running cross country?</u> Join the CMS runners on August 8, 9, and 10th from 9:00-10:00 AM by Door J. A physical is not required to attend. This is available for all 6-8 grade students (boys and girls). Take the initiative and become involved. Students should wear a good pair shoes and bring water.

Over the next few weeks, please check out the school website for additional information regarding back to school information. The supply list is posted on the announcement page as well.

<u>Clear water bottles</u> will be allowed and <u>must</u> remain in the student's locker. Students will not be allowed into classrooms with bottles. In addition, students will be able to use the water fountains as needed.

<u>Open House</u> is scheduled for August 24th beginning at 6:00PM. You will rotate through your child's classes every 10 minutes. The purpose of Open House is for you to meet the staff and have them go over the expectations for this school year. Parking will be available on the north and south sides of the school. Please try and be on time—if you are late, you will miss pertinent information from your child's teachers about the upcoming year. If possible, we ask that your child remain at home; however, if you need to bring them with you to the Open House, please have them remain with you during the evening.

**School pictures** are scheduled for August 18<sup>th</sup> during the day.



## FinalForms and Eventlink are now syncing registrations data



If they already have an Eventlink account, they will receive an email about an update to their calendar subscriptions.


